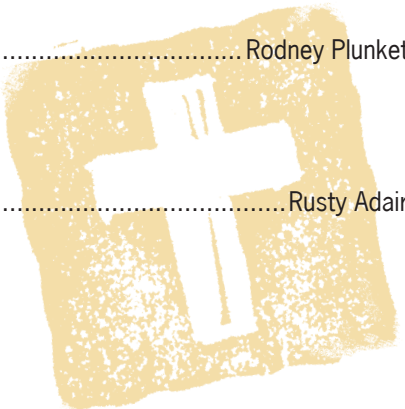

FROM LEON SANDERSON

Our Highlight in Europe

On May 1 we returned from a cruise on the Danube River through the Black Sea Canal from Constanta, Romania, through Bulgaria, Serbia, Croatia to our final stop in Budapest Hungary, with an end-of-trip add-on in Vienna. The unique architecture and the beautiful music of Vienna made the trip worthwhile. We are grateful to be home safely.

However, the highlight of all came as we left Vienna to visit Paris and our dear, sweet sister Colette Daugherty for 4 days. Don and Colette were part of our mission work since the middle 1960's. Don died in 1987 and WS has continued support of Collete all of these years as she has served in 2 congregations. She is currently worshipping with the Deodat church and has been there since early 2000. She is respected and very helpful in working with ladies in and out of the church and with children, while encouraging the minister and his wife, Roland and Rosie, in every way possible. Collete said to us that she is truly at home in this church. Sunday morning was a time for French language and Marilyn and I shared in the best way we could. I spoke on Sunday evening for the primarily English service. Very little sightseeing was done and there was much time spent in conversation and prayer to encourage Colette, making this our real highlight. Let us continue to pray for Colette and all of our other mission points as well as to be grateful for the place where we live and work.

2017 HST SPECIAL CONTRIBUTION

It is likely that you have been taught, counseled, encouraged or influenced by a graduate of Harding School of Theology without realizing it. On **May 21**, you will have the opportunity to participate in a great Kingdom ministry, Harding School of Theology. HST offers five different degree programs and two certificate programs. As of fall 2016, there have been 1,663 graduates and 4,500 students of HST. HST graduates serve as preachers, church planters in multiple states, foreign missionaries in at least 20 countries on 6 continents, and in every other ministry staff position (besides preaching). HST graduates also serve as teachers and administrators in almost every college associated with Churches of Christ, including: Abilene Christian University, Amridge University, Austin Graduate School of Theology, Faulkner University, Freed-Hardeman University, Harding University, Heritage Christian University, Lipscomb University, Lubbock Christian University, Ohio Valley University, Oklahoma Christian University, Pepperdine University, Rochester College, Southwestern Christian College, and York College. They also serve as teachers and administrators in many Christian high schools. Additionally, HST graduates serve as campus ministers on various university campuses, military chaplains, hospital chaplains, and leaders of faith-based organizations (like HopeWorks, AGAPE, and the Family Institute of Tennessee). Graduates also serve as counselors in churches and in more than 20 agencies across the Mid-South alone.

A special contribution will take place next **Sunday, May 21** for Harding School of Theology. The money contributed to HST allows the school to function and provides necessary scholarship funds for its students. In addition to preparing leaders in and outside of the Church, HST offers support to churches with programs like church audit courses at a discounted rate for members of supporting congregations. HST's mission to "challenge Christian leaders to develop deeper faith in God and higher standards of ministry and scholarship" is not possible without your financial support.
