Scriptures to Strengthen

At the start of this new school year, I came across two scriptures in a devotional that have continued to be a strong anchor for me in this already busy school year. I would like to share these scriptures with our community, sincerely hoping it will inspire you as it has me. Psalm 138:3 says, "On the day I called you, You answered me; You made me bold with strength in my soul." It is so hard to fix ourselves to totally depend on Him in everything we do. We always feel as if we have a solution for everything. This particularly gave me comfort in starting a new school year with new responsibilities. First, it reminds me of my duty to simply call on Him; not only for help in difficult situations, but also to express praise and thankfulness for the many blessings he shows me daily. The notion that He will make my soul BOLD with STRENGTH is as powerful as those very words. I encourage us to lean heavily on Him to strengthen our words and actions to be more spiritually effective in our everyday lives.

The other scripture that has empowered me this new year is Romans 11:8. Paul says, "Remember that it is not you who supports the root, but the root supports you."
