Socktober Begins Today!

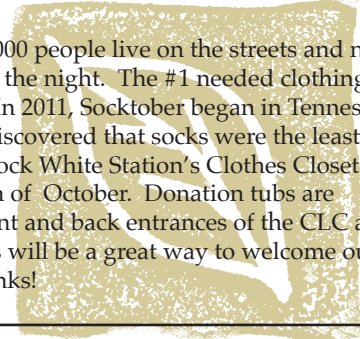

Room in the Inn

What is Room in the Inn (RITI)? Room in the Inn gets its name from the well-known Bible story about a special family coming to a small town called Bethlehem and not finding any room in the inn. We cannot go back 2000 years to change that story, but each night in Memphis we're working to change that story's ending by providing room in the inn. Room in the Inn-Memphis recruits local churches to open their doors to unsheltered guests during the coldest months of the year—November through March. The RITI staff screens guests for overnight stays at area churches. The guests congregate at the Carpenter's House (downtown) before going to their temporary shelter.

One night a week, the hosting congregation sends a van to the Carpenter's House to pick up 12 to 15 guests who have been oriented to the program. When they arrive, the guests put up their belongings then the volunteers and guests share an evening meal/games/ conversation, then the guests may visit the clothing closet and/or take a shower. Two volunteers (called "innkeepers") stay with the guests overnight.

In the morning, the guests enjoy a quick breakfast, get some "to go" (snack) items, then are returned downtown by 7:00 A.M. During the whole experience, the guests and volunteers get to know each other through conversation.

Room in the Inn-Memphis, entering its 8th season, is about changing people, guests and hosts alike. It creates an opportunity for the guests to learn that there are people who truly care for them and for the hosts to understand that the faceless figure on the street corner is more than a statistic. We served 235 individual guests last season. The goal of RITI is to share the love of God through hospitality. RITI does not resolve all of the issues of the homeless or try to "fix" their problems. Of course there are some who are perpetually homeless, but we also have some individuals/families who fall on hard times and simply need assistance to get back on their feet. There were at least 30 people, including some families, who were able to find housing and get off the streets last season alone. Room in the Inn is one of the few shelters that is free. RITI is an opportunity, not an answer. It is an experience, not a solution. To put it quite simply, RITI is a ministry of love.

There were 25 local churches involved in hosting last season. We are VERY excited to announce that White Station will be a hosting site for Room in the Inn during the 2017-2018 season!
