- Write notes or prayers to someone who needs encouragement
- Begin or join a weekly bible study
- Volunteer in the CLC and/or Coffee House
- Host a game night for our college students
- Find a group and take lunch to HopeWorks students and staff
- Volunteer and be a part of Room in the Inn
- Visit someone in the hospital or nursing home
- Set time aside everyday and pray for others
- Intentionally meet neighbors you have not met in your neighborhood
- Volunteer in youth group and children's ministry activities
- Become involved in marriage mentoring
- Volunteer for after-school programs to assist in anyway needed
- Cook or bake something for the sick, lonely, or broken hearted
- Send get-well, birthday, anniversary or sympathy cards to someone
- Invite people over - be hospitable
- Write a letter of encouragement to one of our missionaries

A physical body cannot be healthy if its parts function infrequently. The same is true of the Body of Christ. May we be the people God's always wanted. May we be a Body of Christ for which everyday is "church day."

But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.
