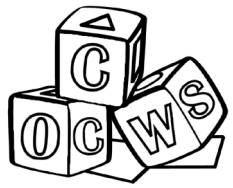

Now What?

The CLC Made It Real, then was unRestricted. Now what?

Journey back with me. Not long ago, we dreamt about a facility that would serve our growing family - a facility that would be a beacon to our community. We dreamt of a facility as a resounding statement of commitment to this neighborhood, meet the needs of this neighborhood, and show God's love to this neighborhood. So, we "Made It Real" by removing the old Annex and building the Community Life Center. God has indeed blessed these efforts. Not long ago, we heard the call for our efforts to be "unRestricted" by giving extra to reach a healthier financial position. The faithfulness of the White Station family was again inspiring. Do you remember?

A key element of the Make It Real campaign was the idea that our new building should be a resource to our community as much as to ourselves (if not more). The CLC has enjoyed a great deal of success in this endeavor! Each week, many people walk through our doors and find God's Love in abundance. Sometimes that Love comes as a box of food. Sometimes that Love comes as fresh clean clothes. Sometimes that Love simply comes as someone who looks them in the eyes and they KNOW they are cared for. It is also found in parenting classes, or Troop meetings, or dominoes games, or a support group, or a training session, or any number of other activities. They see God as they come to exercise and are greeted with warm smiles and encouraging words, not to mention basketball, volleyball, pickleball, or soccer. Echoing that old movie line, "If you build it, they will come," THEY HAVE COME. Each month over 7,000 people walk through the CLC doors to enjoy hospitality. Many are counted among our membership, but most are neighbors who usually leave knowing God's family just a little better. Surely a church that gives to its community like this is getting something right, don't you think?

Our community is coming! Yet, are we here, too? This facility won't build relationships with our guests. We have to do that. We need volunteers at the desks. We need people to host events. We need members to hang out in the Coffee House and welcome our neighbors. This facility is great, but it is just a building without the people in it. The CLC is not really the building with the gym in it. The CLC is you and me working in the kingdom. We need YOU to come pour YOURSELF into our guests. Only then will we be unRestricted. Only then will we have Made It Real.
