An Eastern Sunset

One weekend in college, a couple of friends and I were driving from Searcy to Memphis to catch a concert on a Friday night. As we were driving across Arkansas, the sun began to set. I love watching the sunset. I think that sunsets are one of our most beautiful blessings. But we were driving east. I expressed my annoyance at not being able to watch the sunset to my friend Lindsey. She said something along the lines of the following: "I've really come to enjoy driving away from the sunset. It's a much softer sky, but it's still beautiful. It's just a different kind of beauty."

Sometimes I think that we are so focused on what we're "missing," that we forget to look for the good in what's in front of us. The sky on that eastern drive was beautiful, but I was totally missing it. How many times have I done this in my life? How many times have I been so focused on what didn't happen or what didn't go as planned that I forget all about the beauty of my reality?

God is in the business of creating beauty of all kinds. As the *Gungor* song says: You make beautiful things out of the dust. You make beautiful things out of us.

That concert was over two years ago now, but I still think of that line often. It's just a different kind of beauty. Next time you're frustrated during a "driving away from the sunset" time of life, ask yourself: Am I missing the beauty in this moment? Am I too busy focusing on what's to my back that I'm forgetting about what's straight ahead? Start looking for the different kind of beauty, and you'll see it. It won't be so obvious, it might be a softer sky, but it's there, waiting to be appreciated.



Dr. Martin Luther King spent his life advancing biblical justice for victims of racial discrimination, for the poor, and for the powerless. This past Wednesday evening at 5:45, this legacy was remembered with honor. Beginning with Calvin Ellis leading songs with a palpable pathos, we spent time reflecting on the life of Dr. King with video clips from his "I Have a Dream" and "I've Been to the Mountaintop" speeches. Following the speeches, we observed a moment of silence pierced only by 39 chimes, referencing all Dr. King did for us in his short 39 years of life. We listened to excerpts from John Scott's two-part sermon series preached at White Station on the Sundays following Dr. King's assassination. These words connected members in 1968 and 2018 to the call of scripture to display the mind of Christ on behalf of those without power and privilege. We are thankful for convicting and wise reflections on the legacy of Dr. King and the need to continue the fight against racism. Thanks is due to Calvin Ellis, Ben Fowler, Ellis Haguewood, James Dennis, James Mason, and Paul Morris for participating in this service. A biblical passage used by Dr. King in his "I Have a Dream" speech still rings: "May justice roll down like waters and righteousness like a mighty stream" (Amos 5:24). Amen!
