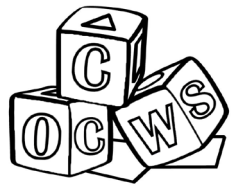

She recently spoke at Discovery Worship for new members. I watched her work the crowd as if she was our full-time ambassador for welcoming new members to White Station. During her visit, she attended all worship services, never failing to hug old friends and meet new ones. While in Memphis, 25 members, former members and/or personal friends rushed to get on her calendar for lunch or dinner and the opportunity to renew those friendships.

Always wanting to be spiritually fed during her visit, Colette attended every service, attended the HST Mission Interest Group and the Memphis Mission Leaders Luncheon at Park Avenue. Sound Doctrine

I grew up among Churches of Christ in Mexico, and very often I heard the phrase "sound doctrine." I remember in one of my first classes as a child, our Bible teacher would teach us that one of the most important things – if not the most important thing – in our spiritual lives was to follow the sound doctrine of the Bible. One of the other kids asked, "What is doctrine?" and the teacher answered, "Well, you have to be careful the way you worship, the way you organize the church, the way you offer salvation to others." As one can imagine, that answer did not clarify all the questions and the confusing thoughts we had as kids at the time.

Later in my life, as a teenager, I learned that the word "doctrine" means "teaching," which created more questions for me because many things that I would regard as "doctrine" did not even appear in the Bible in an explicit way. So, I question myself, is this really doctrine?

Understanding that the word "doctrine" means "teaching," one of the most repetitive doctrines that I found in the Bible is the doctrine of unity. There is not a single book of the New Testament that does not talk about unity. The doctrine of unity comes in many different forms, from many different perspectives, among many different situations, but it is always present somehow. Based on repetition, the doctrine of unity is a very important doctrine in the Bible. To follow unity is to pursue sound doctrine.

Do you remember Jesus's teaching in Mathew 5:21-26? He teaches that we should not bring our offerings until we have made our peace with our brothers and sisters. He put himself in the second place so that we can be in unity with our brothers and sisters.

Yes, to seek unity above everything else is to pursue sound doctrine.
