## How Are Seniors Doing?

The term "seniors" is not welcomed by some whose chronological number [we use the term as 60+] indicates they are part of such a group. Admittedly, there may be topics that thrill us more though no one is exempt from the aging process. This article is to encourage seniors by way of commending activities in which many are already engaged.

Recently our SAM [Senior Adult Ministry] Team took a look at folks in our church family who are in their 6th decade or beyond. The purpose was to see what is being done by those whom the world [particularly the business world] considers the "over-the-hill" gang and consequently out of gas! The task identified what was known about ways in which our 300+ seniors are living the abundant life on behalf of others. Some in this number are now confined yet even many of them are engaged in what they can do, namely calling, note writing and prayer. We arbitrarily grouped 180 identified activities in 13 areas of meaningful ministry. What words describe how our seniors are doing? Consider the following and realize many are engaged in things unknown:

Exercise Class, Handiwork, Home Activities, Hospitality,  
 Leadership, Ministry Volunteer, Missions, Outdoor Activities,  
 General Service, Teaching, Transporting, Visiting, Writing

Is there room for someone to say there is nothing to do? Is there a place for a comment that "I can't get connected to a meaningful activity?" Absolutely not! Do not go there! Talk to an elder, Bible class teacher or a friend. Call the church office and offer yourself. You too can be a "doing" senior!
