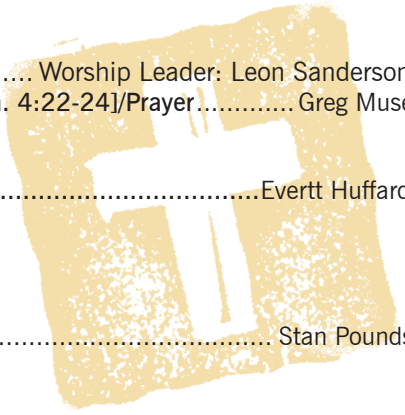

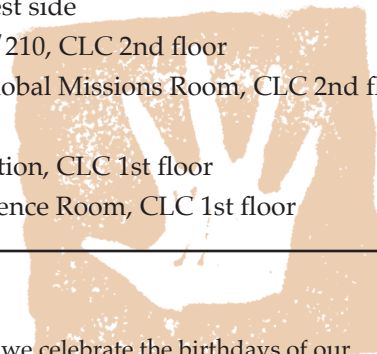

WSYG Miami Mission Trip

Early on Saturday, June 16th, a group of 17 students and volunteers from our youth group met at the airport and left for a week long mission trip to Miami, Florida. We had a great week serving with our friends in south Florida.

We spent our days working with Miami-area organizations such as Hope South Florida, which provides people experiencing homelessness with warm meals and hot showers. We worked with Feeding South Florida, an organization that sorts unwanted (but very useful) food and donates it to 400 non-profit agencies across 4 counties. We also spent two days at Miami Children's Initiative (MCI), an organization that moved into a low-income neighborhood and helped the local school improve from a "D" rating to a "B."

In the evenings, we went to a local park and held a VBS for neighborhood children. Our students came up with a VBS theme and a skit, craft, and game for each night. It was so fun to watch WSYG teens leading this effort.

Each night we ended with a group devo. As per WSYG mission trip tradition, we had a time each night to share where we saw Jesus that day. Students and adults brought up fresh memories of ways the Lord showed his kindness to our group. That's one thing I'm taking away from this trip—the Lord's kindness.

The Lord was kind to us when our 15-passenger van rental fell through as we were in the Miami airport, and another rental company just happened to have one immediately available. He was kind to us when he sent rain to cool us off right before one night of VBS, and children still came to the park after the rain stopped. He was kind to us when there was a sliver of relieving shade as we were painting tables at MCI. The Lord was kind to us when 4 of us were wearing open-toed shoes (a big no-no), but Feeding South Florida happened to have 4 extra pairs of closed-toed shoes in the correct sizes.

The Lord is kind to each one of us every day, and it's up to us to recognize it and call it out. The Lord was kind to us through your prayers for our team. Thank you for supporting us as we went to serve and learn from our friends in Miami. Over the next couple days, please continue to pray for our WSYG Ghana team as they travel home. They return tomorrow (Monday) night, and I'm sure they'll be ready to share how the Lord was kind to them.
