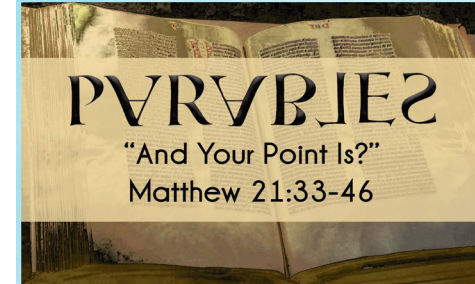

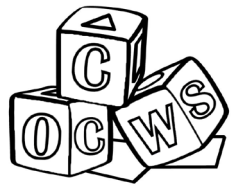

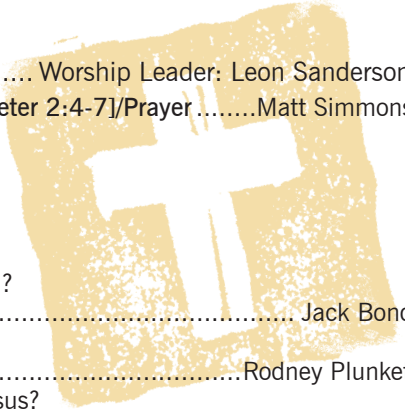

Problems and Plans

There are many ways to fill in the blank when it comes to PROBLEMS we face in life. Currently, our family is dealing with cancer concerns. Our daughter-in-law has breast cancer and has had surgery. Following a soon-to-be-received pathology report, a treatment plan will be determined. She is 42 and has 4 children, ages 2-12. The husband of our niece has pancreatic cancer and is undergoing treatment. His treatment has changed several times in an attempt to find something that will do some good.

In an unknown family to me, though a well-known name to many, is Tony Dungy, a highly successful, professional football player and coach. He is now a sports analyst frequently seen on national TV. He and his wife, Lauren, have several children, one of whom committed suicide at age 19.

More than likely each of you could share a story about hardship, illness, financial reversal, death, or other serious difficulty. What are appropriate PLANS for those facing serious PROBLEMS to go on with life?

In his biographical book of 2007, Tony Dungy writes of 2 responses to his son's death. He turned to scripture for strength, specifically Romans 8:28 where the apostle Paul writes that in all things God works for the good of those who love him. He also continued coaching with special attention to serving others.

I have a plan with two responses to think about. I go to scripture for strength and hope, specifically Proverbs 3:5-6 where inspired wisdom calls us to trust in the Lord with all of our hearts and lean not on our own understanding. I also engage in fervent prayer on behalf of the situation.

While none of these actions provide an answer to PROBLEMS, they do give us a chance to PLAN to grow in faith, patience and dependence on God, the One who knows all about us and can see us through. May any PROBLEM we face draw us to develop a comparable PLAN to make it in this life, a world that is not our home.
