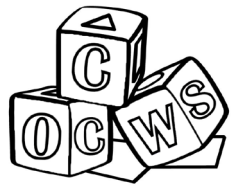

Shine the Light

As a high school student I loved reading so much that I would wait until everyone had gone to bed, and then I would get my booklight to read under the covers. That small booklight could light up the entire room if I allowed it, but I did not want to disturb anyone else with the bright light nor get told that I needed to put it away and go to sleep. Consequently, I kept this bright light all to myself under the covers.

This summer, White Station focused on parables and the stories Jesus told in the gospels. I am reminded of Matthew 5:15, which paints an unusual story: "Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house." I might wonder why someone would light a lamp and hide it, but then I am reminded of my high school self. I could create multiple reasons for hiding a light, and sometimes I am tempted to do that spiritually.

If I thought sharing my faith would create an uncomfortable situation, whether at work or school or with family or friends, I may be tempted to hide my light. If I love my church family the way it is and become fearful that inviting someone new may disrupt the routine I love at church, I may be inclined to seal my lips. If I profess an active faith in Jesus but avoid situations that would test that faith, then I may be sticking my lamp under a basket.

The truth is, there are no good reasons to hide the light of the gospel, yet I am still tempted to place my lamp under a basket. Let me encourage you this week to consider one opportunity where you might shine your light when you otherwise would not. Who knows, that one instance may be all it takes to lead one person from the shadows of sin into the light of Jesus. And if not, you can be proud that you placed your lamp on a stand to send forth light.
