### God's Desire for Us

In my Christian life, one of the biggest challenges has been trying to understand Mathew 5. More specifically, the Beatitudes. I always wonder, "What are they? Are they commandments? Is that just rabbinic philosophy?" I have read and listened to many different explanations about them. There are a good number of books written for the sake of the Beatitudes.

As a kid, one of my Sunday school teachers gave an explanation that has been with me my whole life. She said, "The secret to understanding the nature of the Beatitudes is in the word itself. Look, the word is 'Beatitude,' and that word is composed by two words 'be' and 'attitude.' Therefore, if you want to experience the reward that is in the second line of each one, you have to make big efforts to have the right attitude." This explanation made it even more difficult to understand the nature of these verses.

So, for many years, every time I read them, I was reminded that if I wanted to experience what Jesus is promising in those lines, I needed to make bigger efforts. Of course, this technique is not very successful in a spiritual life. At least not in mine. Very often I felt like I was not able to experience Jesus' promises in Mathew 5 because I was not "sacrificing" enough "to reach" them.

Not long ago, I sought to change this perspective. A friend and teacher shared with me the original Latin meaning of the word. The main idea in the Latin was that in these verses, Jesus is expressing His desires for us. Not only what Jesus wishes for us, but these are Jesus' deep hopes for our spiritual lives.

Now, every time I read the Beatitudes, it is like a love letter dedicated to me. God desires for us to be part of his heavenly kingdom, to be comforted, to inherit his new creation, to be satisfied, to receive mercy, to see God, and to be called sons of God. I don't have to struggle every day with my "works of righteousness" trying to reach God's promises. Now I can rest in God's grace and enjoy His desires and hopes for me.
