

Gulf Coast Getaway

Looking for the fountain of youth? Try being over 50 years old and hanging with over one thousand college students for 4 days! It is the most exhausting thing I do, but I wouldn't have it any other way. Each year for the past several years during the MLK holiday, Dan and I have traveled with the SOMA kids to Panama City Beach, Florida to experience Gulf Coast Getaway, and it is an experience like none other.

We are blessed to take a chartered bus so we can all ride together on that lovely 8+ hour ride. The 25 of us who went this year grew closer during our 4 days together. When we get there, the first worship is at 9 p.m., yep it *started* at 9 p.m.! Most sessions last for about an hour and forty-five minutes but you don't realize it. You are singing, worshipping and soaking in great lessons. This year's speaker was Don McLaughlin. He also joined us for dinner Sunday evening. It was cool watching our kids interact with him. Just when you think you can't be more proud of them, you see them donate money to help folks who suffered in the Panama City hurricane. These "poor" college students collected \$20,940 to help others, and they do it year after year. It makes my heart happy that they allow this old lady to hang out with them! Bring on GCG 2020!

Gulf Coast challenges me to my very core. I love taking our college kids to this experience every year. A few of our kids who went have shared below some of their thoughts and feelings so you don't have to just listen to me and take my word for it:

FROM KELSI ELKINS: For three days, over 1,000 college students sang out these words: "Who the Son sets free, Oh is free indeed. I'm a child of God. I am chosen not forsaken. I am who You say I am." Worshipping at GCG with fellow college-age Christians gives me hope and encouragement for who God is and how He is working. How good it is to be reminded of God's love, mercy, and faithfulness.

FROM AVERY EFAW: I grew up hearing about Gulf Coast Getaway and seeing the bus in the White Station parking lot every year, but I never understood the importance of the trip until I got to experience it. The power of worshipping and learning about Jesus with so many other college students, all while surrounded by His beauty and power on the Florida beaches, reminded me that I am not alone in this walk. Gulf Coast Getaway is a strong testament to the power of our community through Christ and an experience that I am so grateful for!

FROM ABBY HENSLEY: Gulf Coast Getaway is an awesome opportunity for SOMA to strengthen as a community; this is one of our big events that we look forward to. We are able to get to know each other on a more personal and spiritual level. The thing I love most about GCG is meeting students from other college ministries. It's an awesome reminder of how important these ministries are and what an impact they make. It brings awareness of how awesome our ministry is and how blessed we are with so many people pouring love into us.

FROM HANNAH DAVEY: Hearing Don speak again was something I really looked forward to, and of course being at the beach for a weekend was awesome! There was one day that Becca, Abby, and I took one of the adult's cars and crossed the bridge to view a small portion of the hurricane damage from October. The money we donated while being there won't be used for anything other than the aid of the community. I felt like us being there wasn't just for our spiritual benefit but also to the benefit of Panama. It was another neat experience!

FROM BECCA SMITH: Gulf Coast Getaway is awesome because it gives you time to be at the beach with great friends and enjoy some fellowship together. I absolutely love how we eat together for every meal and worship together as a group with about 1,000 other college students. I am so thankful for the bonds created at GCG this year and for the time we were able to spend together.

Our annual SOMA Benefit Dinner was last night, and maybe you were not able to attend but are wondering how you can be involved with my great kids. (They don't like me calling them that... I guess I should call them "young adults" but they *are* my kids.) I'm never at a loss for words talking about SOMA.
