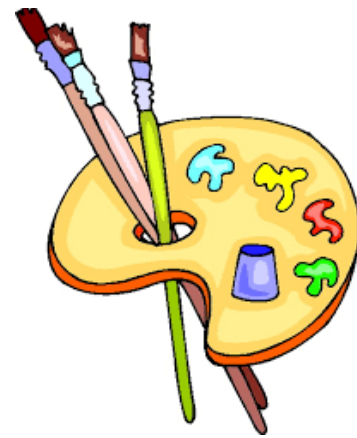

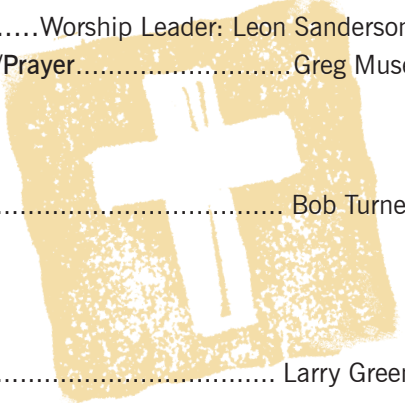

## Do We See What We Want To See?

John 20:1-10 records a story of those visiting the tomb of Jesus on the first day of the week. Mary Magdalene saw the stone rolled away. The "other disciple," who did not enter the tomb, saw linen burial cloths. Peter saw the linen cloths and the face cloth from the head of Jesus and it was laying folded by itself. The last viewing in this story was by the "other disciple" who entered the tomb, "saw and believed." Perhaps each of the three visitors moved from query with awe to faith.

We do see in different ways. About the crowds Jesus said, "seeing they do not see" [Matthew 13:13]. Paul spoke of minds being veiled so as not to "gaze" appropriately at the old covenant [2 Corinthians 3:12-14]. In this same letter, Paul commended looking not at things seen but at things unseen, because the unseen were eternal [2 Corinthians 4:18]. Peter called some nearsighted and blind because they had forgotten cleansing from former sins [2 Peter 1:9]. Now to "question time."

What do we see in people? Does our casual gaze lead to any of these conclusions: not interested in good news, not able to comprehend anything, not stable, not financially solvent, not educated, not interested in having a home, not of value, do not look like me, or any other "first impression" that is not the truth? Thomas Edison was told on one occasion that he ought to quit school, go home and give up because he did not have a capacity for learning.

What do we see in worship? Is our attention drawn to a song that is improperly pitched or too slow or fast, a poor sermon, a prayer that is too long or uses incorrect words, an individual across the way whom I do not know, someone who has drawn a different conclusion on a spiritual matter or one who looks like she/he does not belong in our church?

This is where it gets dangerous! John said Jesus "had done so many signs before them," yet "they still did not believe in him" [John 12:37]. John declared they were fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy, with blinded eyes and hardened hearts "lest they see with their eyes and understand with their hearts" [John 12:40]. The following statement is a poor place to begin: "My mind is made up; don't confuse me with the facts." My prayer is that we will look at all people as they really are, made in the image of God and loved by Him through the gift of His Son.
