Volunteers Needed

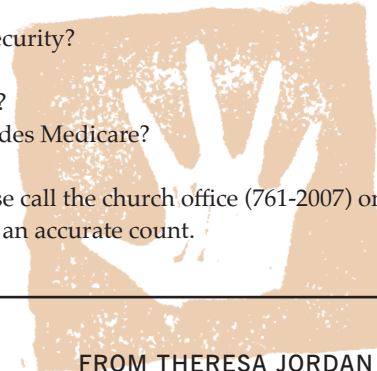

Leon Sanderson

Two important events occurred at White Station in 1979: the dedication of the new auditorium and hiring Leon Sanderson as associate minister. One long-time member told me last week that the most important of these was hiring Leon. I have been a member here since 1964, and I strongly agree with that sentiment. Leon informed the elders last week that he would be retiring from full-time ministry on June 30th.

Leon has served this church for 40 years as associate minister under 5 different ministers. His consistent service has been an important positive factor through all our changes. He has used his talents in many different ways. As the most well-known living hymnologist in our fellowship, we have been fortunate to have him lead singing and be involved in worship planning for the auditorium service. He's organized ThankSinging, preached and led singing at funerals, and arranged for groups to sing at funerals and at nursing and retirement homes. His multi-faceted ministry has included teaching Bible classes, organizing LIFE groups, launching the Involvement Ministry, beginning the weekly business luncheon, and creating the Senior Adult Ministry. More importantly Leon is that smiling face who visits hospitals and nursing homes, shows up to pray for you before surgery, calls you on your birthday, and develops friendships with visitors to the CLC.

Leon considers himself a life-long learner. He says very little about his education, but he has a B.A. from Harding University, a B.S. in music from the University of Memphis, and the following degrees from Harding School of Theology: M.A., Master of Religious Education, Master of Divinity, and Doctor of Ministry. He uses this education very effectively in all the ministries he's involved in.

To relate Leon's service to the church beyond White Station would require many more words than I'm allotted in this article, but in Memphis he has been associate minister at Highland Street Church of Christ, minister at Holmes Road Church of Christ, and preached part-time at Park Avenue Church of Christ. He is well-known throughout our fellowship as a song leader for campaigns and gospel meetings, conducting hymnology workshops and singing schools, and his articles and presentations on hymns.

A special day of celebration is planned to honor Leon on **Sunday, June 23rd**. Mark your calendars, it will be a Sunday morning you don't want to miss!
