## WSYG Missions

Both of our WSYG mission trip teams have returned home as of this week! Each summer, students in our youth group serve with people that we support as a congregation. This year, we went to Rhode Island and Ghana. Teens had the opportunity to learn about mission work and partner with our friends from other places. Though they all participated in the same activities, every student came away with a different perspective on the trips. Here are a few examples of what students took away from the mission trips:

"It was amazing to be in a place I had heard of for my entire life. It is now obvious why Ghana holds such a special place in White Station's heart. It was an exhausting trip, but so fulfilling because I know that the relationships I made are long lasting."

It can be intimidating going to a new country not knowing what you are going to be stepping into, but the people of Ghana make you feel like family and love you endlessly. You realize that while you are going to make a difference in their life, they end up make a bigger one in yours."

"I was really expecting to have some huge religious moment that would change my life forever, but in the land of hot wieners there wasn't just one moment where I was like, "Oh hey God, that's pretty life changing!" However, when I got home I realized something had changed inside of me. My dad was having a get together for his birthday, and one of his friends has a 8 month baby boy. As soon as they walked in, I ran to the baby, and that's when it hit me: I wasn't scared of kids anymore. The VBS we held in Rhode Island had changed my fear of children. While teaching them about God, they were teaching me that not all kids throw tantrums and hate me. I am now very proud to say that I'm not afraid of kids, so now I won't be afraid to bond with them. This might seem a little weird to normal people who aren't afraid of tiny people, but it's quite an accomplishment for me."
