Our next blood drive is **Wednesday, January 15th, 2020**. Appointments are open now. Karl and Martha have agreed to prepare a special meal for us that evening!

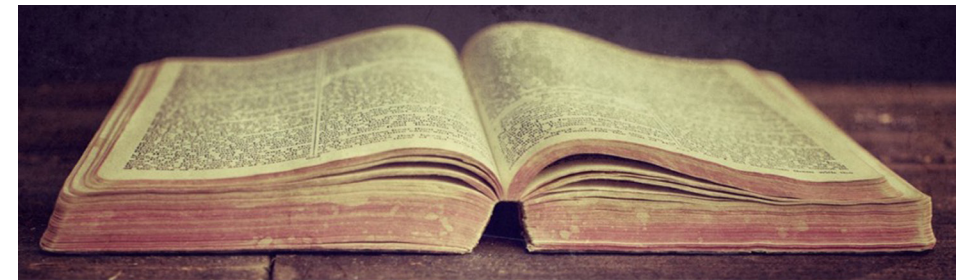

Finding Your Spot

Twenty-four years ago, David and I moved from Nashville to Memphis with two kids in tow. We had been given all types of advice about our move, especially around where we would want to worship. Our very first Sunday we set out on our journey to find a new church home. It wasn't what I expected, and it wasn't an easy journey! I remember enjoying the time of worship tremendously but at the same time feeling very unnoticed. I wanted so much to find our spot in our new city. Before long, I found myself dreading Sundays. When Sunday did come around, I found myself in tears. This went on for months.

We eventually ended up at White Station and found a home. I share this for two reasons. First, over the past several weeks I have noticed new faces in our worship service! I often wonder how they are experiencing our service. Do they feel unnoticed? Are they looking for a place to belong? On many occasions, I think I am going to go over and meet them right after worship, but before I can get there, I see someone I know and really want to speak with. Before I realize it, I have missed my opportunity. I want to encourage each of us to make sure we are very intentional in seeking out those who might be visiting or even those that our feeling unnoticed. Trust me, it means a lot to a visitor when they feel like someone took the time to meet them and show interest in who they are as a person!

Second, if you are visiting or sitting in the pews feeling unnoticed, I want to make a suggestion that has always proven to help me feel a part. Find a ministry and get involved! Next Sunday, September 15th, we are having a Ministry Fair during class (9:00 am in the CLC Gym). If you talk to anyone who is actively involved in a ministry, they will most likely share that their involvement helped them feel a part of our church body. Taking the step to be active in ministry within the body can be a blessing to you and to others. It would be easy to choose not to attend, especially if you are visiting or if you are feeling like an outsider looking in. I understand that, but I want to encourage you not to miss this! Take the brave step and sign up to be a part of one thing, just one, and hopefully you will very quickly find your spot.
