It Takes a Village

For the past 20 or so years, our church family has welcomed our newest additions in a service we call "Baby Blessing Sunday." The opportunity to celebrate new life is one of my favorite things we do as a church family. The big smiles on the faces of the moms & dads, the ear to ear grins on the faces of the big brothers and sisters, and the beaming faces of grandparents and extended family members as they stand up front with their greatest blessings are truly mesmerizing. Getting to see the pictures of the little ones and getting to read the prayers of their parents remind us all that each and every child is truly a miraculous gift from God and should be treasured as such.

However, if past years are any indication of what will happen this morning, not every child will be happy throughout the entire worship service, and neither will every adult. Regardless of whether you are a young infant or one of our more senior members, distractions cause us all to focus at times on what we don't have. While we very readily understand the infant who cries because of hunger or a wet diaper, we are not always as understanding of the young family who struggles financially, or the student who faces the weight of school and societal pressure to succeed, or the complications faced in marriages of all ages, or the sometimes debilitating fears faced by each one of us when we contemplate our own mortality. If we are not careful, Satan will take our joys and turn them into something dark and sinister.

While the old adage "it takes a village to raise a child" is as true today as ever, it is also true when it comes to caring for another within our church family as well as our friends and neighbors. As a church family, we will pledge this morning to be involved in the lives of these little ones, to teach, to encourage, and to show them by our words and actions the love of Christ. We will pledge to walk alongside their parents, sharing our love, insights and successes and failures. Our God asks that we do no less for our brothers and sisters, and for all of those we come into contact with during our daily lives.

Community is a loaded word in our world today. We deeply long for community while we isolate ourselves more than ever. God's idea of community is revealed through his calling of each of us to be an active and involved part of the body of Christ. As we celebrate this morning the new life represented by our newest members, let's also celebrate our life in Christ. Let's live lives worthy of our calling and encourage those around us to do the same.
