A Convenient Way to Give

As we all look for ways to streamline our check writing, Online Banking Bill Pay emerges as an easy, convenient way to make automatic contributions. By simply going to your online banking website, you can set up automatic payments to the church by dates and frequencies of your choice. Your bank cuts a check payable to White Station and physically mails it to us with your name and address as the payer. This check is then scanned and recorded to your contribution statement with the next Sunday's offering. You can even designate different payments for specific funds on a periodic basis. 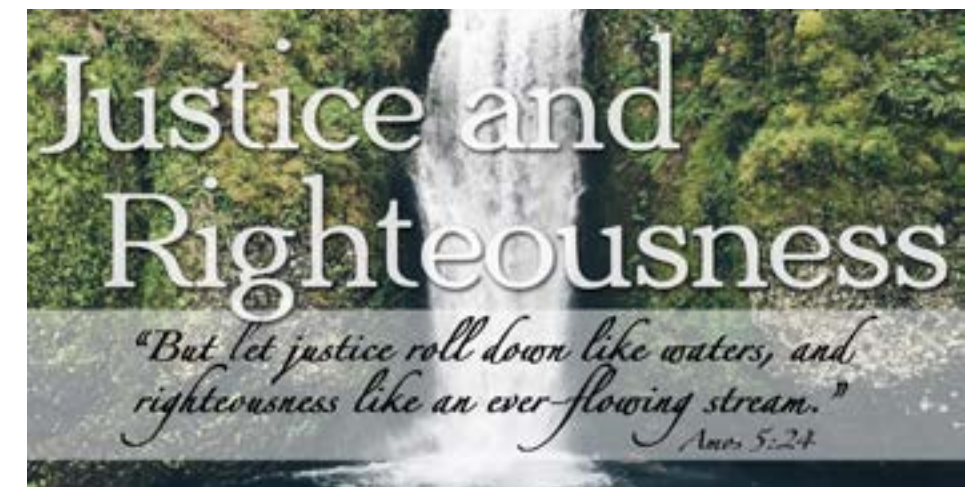

From The Shepherds

Coming together as a church family for times of worship and fellowship is life giving, connecting us to God the Father and to each other. When viruses and sickness become a possible hindrance to experiencing the love of Jesus as a body of believers, it is concerning to all of us.

The White Station shepherds and ministers care deeply about the health of the White Station church, spiritually and physically. Considering state and national recommendations for best health care practices, we feel it wise to make the following recommendations to our White Station church family to prevent the spread of germs, keeping us as healthy as possible.

- Wash/scrub your hands often with soap for at least 20 seconds.
- Use hand sanitizer found in all worship venues and classrooms.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, mouth or face with unwashed hands.
- Cover your mouth/nose with a sleeve or tissue when coughing/sneezing.
- Stay at home if you or your children are sick.
- Our facilities staff is regularly sanitizing all commonly touched areas.
- To minimize multiple touches of communion bread, it will be broken into smaller individual bite size pieces by our preparers in a sanitary manner.

It is in these moments as in all challenging experiences of our lives that we hear the reassuring words of Jesus saying, "Do not be afraid." May we move forward in the days ahead with courage and faith, not fear. Please let us know if there is anything we can do for you or your family.
